

# REGULAR MEETING MINUTES THURSDAY, October 17, 2019 AT 6:00 PM

## 1. CALL TO ORDER, INVOCATION AND PLEDGES TO FLAGS

Mayor Andy Williams called the meeting to order at 6:03 pm. A quorum was present. Mayor Pro-tem Joan Hinshaw and Councilmembers Butch Reis, David Williams and James Bilberry were all present. Councilmember George French III was absent.

Councilmember James Bilberry performed the Invocation. Councilmember Butch Reis led the Pledge to Flags.

#### 3. PUBLIC HEARING

The Public Hearing began at 6:05 pm.

Mishad Harmon – resides on Button Bush Court has concerns as to the property value, crime rate and noise. Request to know how this rv park would impact them as residents directly.

Ralph Baker – resides on FM 439 agrees to the rv park and will help the property with his side of the fence.

Rayne Bell – resides on Sugar Maple, does not support the RV Park, RV Park does not meet the needs of the City of Nolanville, area can be used for much more.

Gary Newman – Weeping Willow Court, FM 439 needs turning lane, with RV Park it should limit the time of stay.

Linda Strapp of Belton expressed her approval of the RV park.

Charles Kykendall lives in Basin Park. He expressed that rv park will be a great place to live. He travels and could be considered a second home.

Bradley Johnston – resides on Slippery Elm. Believe facility is clean as it is now. Fence is only 8ft and needs better lighting. Would prefer it to be located elsewhere.

Jim Wright – area will need to be rezoned with proper lighting. This project will cost him approximately 2 million dollars. He is not in the business of losing money.

Several Wildwood residents expressed concerns over the absence of a turning lane into the subdivision off of FM 439.

The Public Hearing closed at 6:37 pm.
