Remember, the call-taker's questions are important to get the right kind of help to you quickly. Be prepared to follow any instructions the call-taker gives you. Many 911 centers can tell you exactly what to do until help arrives, such as providing step-by-step instructions to aid someone who is choking or needs first aid or CPR. Do not hang up until the call-taker instructs you to do so.

The Nolanville Police Department is a 24-hour, 7-days a week police department. Officers are on the road during most of the day and the Bell County Communication Center (911 Center) provides our dispatch needs. If you need a Police Officer at any time for any reason, please call 911 in emergencies and non-emergencies.

IN AN EMERGENCY, DIAL OR TEXT 911 IMMEDIATELY

An emergency is any situation that requires immediate assistance from the police, fire department or ambulance. Examples include:

- A fire
- A crime, especially if in progress
- A car crash, especially if someone is injured
- A medical emergency, especially for symptoms that require immediate medical attention
- A request to have an officer come to your location
- A report of a suspicious person

If you're not sure whether the situation is a true emergency, officials recommend calling 911 and letting the call-taker determine whether you need emergency help.

When you call 911, be prepared to answer the call-taker's questions, which may include:

- The location of the emergency, including the street address
- The phone number you are calling from
- The nature of the emergency
- Details about the emergency, such as a physical description of a person who may have committed a crime, a description of any fire that may be burning, or a description of injuries or symptoms being experienced by a person having a medical emergency



Welcome



Nolanville is heavily influenced by nearby Fort Hood military base and is proud to be called “a great place to live” by the diverse military and civilian families who live along her tree-lined streets. Within her city limits can be found urban and rural areas and it is not unusual to see cattle, horses, goats, and sheep grazing in her green

pastures as well as an occasional deer, fox, coyote or feral hog. Nolanville is designated a Keep Texas Beautiful Gold Star Affiliate and is a Certified Scenic City.

Neighborhood schools are modern and well-equipped with dedicated and involved staff. Opportunities for higher education are offered by University of Mary Hardin-Baylor, Texas A&M University Central Texas, and Central Texas College - all within 13 miles of the city.

Nearby Stillhouse and Belton Lakes host a variety of recreational activities including boating, fishing, swimming, camping, skiing, and hiking. In town, the J.W. Sims Community Center is a central meeting place for area residents with a well-

equipped kitchen and recently updated restrooms. Nolanville is proud of its newly-developed Monarch Park featuring a covered playground equipment area, scent garden, splash pad, basketball court, picnic areas, walking trails and a multi-use facility with restrooms and snack bar facilities. A new sports field hosts area youth football and soccer events. Small pocket parks are scattered throughout the city; walking and bicycling are highly encouraged.

Nolanville is focused on building a thriving city while preserving its small town atmosphere with citizen volunteers and an energetic city staff working together to keep Nolanville “A Great Place to Live.”

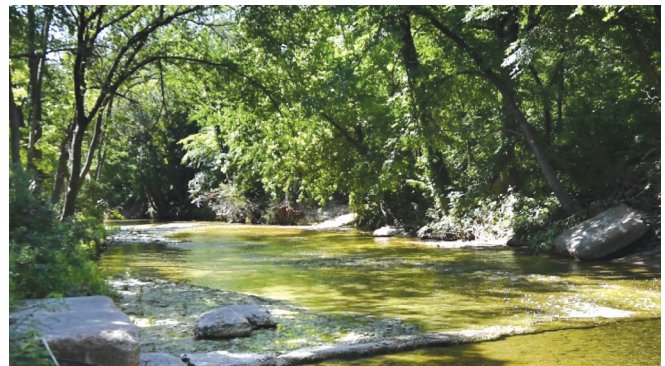


BELTON LAKE

Community Input

There is more than one way to contribute to the City's growth and development. If you don't have time to volunteer, fill out the community survey. The survey can be found on the City's website at nolanvilletx.gov or stop by City Hall.

City Boards

Planning & Zoning: The Planning and Zoning Commission is charged with making planning and zoning decisions on behalf of the City of Nolanville. The Planning and Zoning Commission's primary responsibility concerns updating and implementing the land use section of the City of Nolanville's Comprehensive Plan. The Commission makes reports for, and recommendations to, the City Council regarding changes to zoning regulations, the City's zoning map or the City's zoning ordinance. The Commission may also call public hearings to determine proper zoning for a tract of land or for an area.

Tree Board: The Tree Board was established in accordance with the Tree City USA Program. This board provides clear guidance for

planting as well as maintaining and/or removing trees from streets, parks and other public spaces. The Tree Board also advises City Council as to activities that should be required or prohibited. The Tree Board, comprised of EDC Board Members and concerned citizens, reports to the EDC Board.

Economic Development Board: The Nolanville Economic Development Board leads economic development activities for the promotion, marketing, attraction and retention of business endeavors within the City of Nolanville. The NEDC is responsible for the attraction and retention of new and existing commercial, industrial and manufacturing prospects, the marketing of industrial and commercial sites, and the

identification of target commercial and industrial enterprises.

Zoning Board of Adjustment: The Zoning Board of Adjustment works administratively with individual and neighborhood zoning decisions. The Zoning Board of Adjustment has the power to hear appeals from individuals contesting the decision of the City's zoning enforcement officer in enforcing the zoning ordinance and City rules and regulations, hear and decide special exceptions/conditional use permits, and grant variances from the provisions of the zoning ordinance when unusual conditions create an unnecessary hardship.

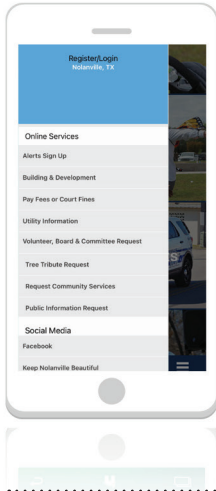

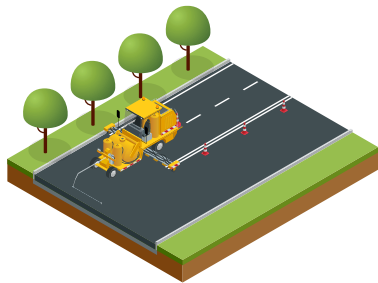

TRASH SERVICES

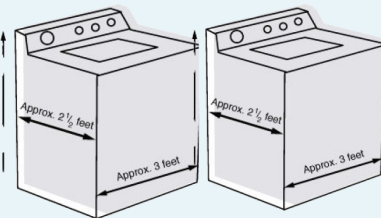
The City contracts with Texas Disposal Systems. Trash is part of your WCID #3 Water Bill. If your water provider is other than WCID #3, you receive a bill separately.



How much trash can I put out for TDS each week?

Your cart, plus 2 additional 30 gallon bags or bundles each week (35lb or less per bag).

1 Free BULKY TRASH CURBSIDE PICKUP PER YEAR



- **\$42 + TAX & FEES PER LOAD AFTER 1ST LOAD.**
- Bulky Pickup size is about the size of a washer and dryer sitting next to one another (extra charge for larger loads)

BULKY PICK UP SIZE = 3 CUBIC YARDS

Examples of bulky trash:

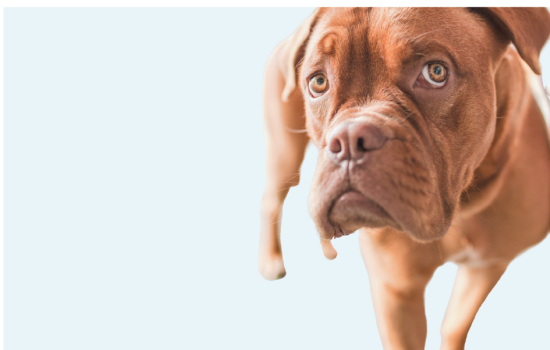

Central Bell County Fire/Rescue provides full spectrum Fire, Rescue, and EMS services to the City of Nolanville and surrounding communities that make a 40+ mile response area. CBCFR currently provides a certified Search and Rescue team, Water Rescue, Technical Rescue Team, and staff of 40 Firefighters, to include several EMT's that are located on each shift.

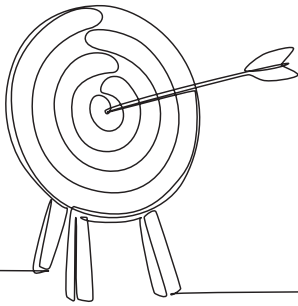

RESIDENTIAL ZONES

In residential zones, vehicles cannot be parked on the grassy or unsurfaced areas of your front, side-street or rear yard. Parking on grass is not allowed to prevent the physical and aesthetic deterioration of the yard, as well as oil leaks that will contaminate the ground water.

JUNKED, WRECKED CARS

are not allowed to be parked, stored or kept on any public or private property visible from any public or private street, right-of-way or adjacent property. This includes vehicles not being used for their original purpose or which are incapable of being used, as well as those that have been destroyed, badly damaged, or which are in a state of disrepair.



STAGNANT WATER

Do not accumulate stagnant water on your property, due to the potential threat of disease from mosquitoes.



TRASH/LITTER

Property owners, agents, occupants and renters have the duty and responsibility to keep property clean and free of trash and litter.



BUILDING / STRUCTURE

No building or structure may be erected, altered, or enlarged without first obtaining a building permit, which may be acquired in the permitting office.



GRASS/WEEDS

No property owner shall allow grass, weeds or other types of ground cover to be more than 12 inches in height or be uncultivated. Keep grass and weeds below 12 inches and keep bamboo or other ground covers manicured and contained in your property.



SIGNS

Do not place any hand-made or other signs on utility poles, streets or right-of-way. Obtain a sign permit before erecting, replacing, relocating or altering any sign.
