...and to live in a city home to so many of our active duty and retired military, similar to myself. The Council and I strive to improve the quality of life in Nolanville to maintain our smalltown atmosphere.

We have made some great strides in pride and place identification. Our pedestrian mobility improved and increased safety in one of our more established areas. Avenue H and Mesquite Street increased capacity by adding bike lanes and sidewalks. Neighborhood identification was added, as well as bus shelter areas. You'll notice some traffic islands along Mesquite that are meant to slow down drivers that are traveling to the City's largest park. The combination of these elements is considered "Complete Streets" and is how we intend to approach every project. We will move construction to the Northwest side of the City in September, adding sidewalks to connect to Main Street, directing walkers off of the Spur and onto a safer route.

The Staff is gearing up to host the Annual Fox Trot and Jamboree on September 24th. Please save the date and spend time getting to know your neighbors.

If you want to make a difference in the community, November 5th is our designated "Make a Difference Day." Activities will be planned to enhance pocket parks on St. John Street and Ryan Circle. August Community Spotlight: misha johnson: city of nolanville court clerk II



Misha Johnson of the Nolanville Municipal Court in Nolanville, Texas, has completed all the requirements for Level II of the Municipal Court Clerk Certification Program and was awarded the certification on July 25, 2022, by the Texas Court Clerks Association (TCCA) in conjunction with the Texas Municipal Courts Education Center (TMCEC), the Texas Municipal Courts Association (TMCA), and Texas State University-San Marcos. Ms. Johnson has served in the Nolanville Municipal Court since November 2017.

To qualify for level II certification, clerks must complete 40 hours of continuing education and pass a four-hour exam. Areas covered by the examination include legal research, ethics, fairness and diversity, processing cases, legal codes and statutes, records and case flow management, financial management, bond forfeitures, domestic violence, and computer literacy.

TCCA is a non-profit professional association of municipal and justice court clerks and administrators. Its purpose is to increase the proficiency of judicial administrators and clerical personnel through education and exchanging ideas. Founded in 1972, TCCA is an affiliate of the Texas Municipal League and offers its members various services and programs.

TMCEC is a project of the Texas Municipal Courts Association and is funded by a grant from the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals. TMCEC provides judicial and legal education for municipal judges, clerks, and prosecutors through monthly regional seminars and an (800) telephone line. TMCA is an association composed of municipal judges, clerks, prosecutors, and court support personnel. It monitors legislation, attorney general opinions, and changes in case law to ensure that the 918 municipal courts in Texas remain current on the law.

The CBCFR is raffling off several handcrafted and donated items to raise funds for much-needed replacements of critical gear.



Nolanville Announces Contest For Residents Who Download and Use the My Nolanville App

Every Monday afternoon starting September 12th until October 3rd, one user from the following week's reports will be drawn randomly for a gift to be picked up at City Hall during business hours Monday – Friday 8 AM – 5 PM.

Nearly three hundred community runners', joggers and walkers are expected to join at Nolanville City Hall at 9 am on Saturday, September 24, for Nolanville's annual Fox Trot 5K & 1K Color Run.

Presented by the City of Nolanville as part of the Cen-Tex Race Series will be a fun-filled, rain or shine event featuring a live 5K Run, a live 1K Color Run, and a virtual 5K & 10K. There will be a free Gladiator competition between the race finish and the awards presentation.

Participants who pre-register through September 14 on the race run website (here) will receive an official race shirt, a runners' bag, and a free taco at the finish line.

Race Day Registration begins at 8:00 am. Entry fees are \$20 before September 15 and \$25 after September 15.





Early packet pick-up for all pre-registered runners will be Friday, September 23, at City Hall, 101 North 5th Street, Nolanville, Texas 76559, Monday-Friday, 8 am-12 pm and 1 pm-5 pm.

Race-day packet pick-up and race-day registration will run from 7:30–8:45 am. Cash, check, and credit accepted.
