# CITY OF NOLANVILLE ANNOUNCES TRANSITION TO WASTE MANAGEMENT FOR TRASH, BULK AND RECYCLING SERVICES

Residents are set to benefit from an enhanced waste management system beginning November 1st, aimed at promoting cleanliness and sustainability in the community. The new service will introduce several key changes to waste collection and recycling efforts.

The updated waste service includes weekly curbside trash pickup, curbside recycling every other week, and monthly bulk and brush collection.

Additionally, a call-in service for hazardous materials disposal will be available to residents, providing a safe and convenient way to manage potentially dangerous items.



## Welcome To WM

WM is proud to provide waste and recycling service to Nolanville residents beginning November 1, 2024.

### New services include:

- Weekly garbage collection
- Every-other-week recycling collection
- Monthly brush and bulk collection
- Hazardous Household Waste (HHW) collection with WM At Your Door Services

More information coming soon.



The service schedule will vary based on residents' locations. For those living north of I-14, trash will be collected on Mondays, with bulk and brush service provided on the first Thursday of each month. South of I-14, trash collection will take place on Thursdays, with bulk and brush services scheduled for the third Thursday of the month. Recycling will occur every other Wednesday, with specific dates outlined in a community calendar.

Residents are reminded that November 1st falls on a Friday. Those currently receiving Friday service will have their trash collected that day only, after which they are encouraged to follow the new schedule. As part of the transition, residents can expect the delivery of two 96-gallon carts—one for trash and one for recycling—between October 21st and 25th. Until the end of October, residents should continue using their Texas Disposal Systems (TDS) carts. On the last service day of October, TDS carts should be left out for pickup, with remaining carts collected during the first week of November.



# WASTE MANAGEMENT FAQ'S

To ensure effective curbside collection, all items must be placed inside the cart with the lid closed. Items should not be left outside the cart, except during designated bulk and brush service weeks.

For residents needing additional capacity, extra trash or recycling carts can be purchased for \$3.50 per month by contacting the City of Nolanville. The monthly bulk and brush pickup will accommodate up to five cubic yards of waste, with residents simply required to place items in a neat pile by the curb.

Accepted recyclables include plastic bottles, cans, clean paper, and flattened cardboard. Residents are reminded that glass, food, foam, plastic bags, batteries, clothing, and carpet are not eligible for recycling. Detailed information will be available on the lid of the new recycling carts.

Additionally, the city will offer the "At Your Door" program for the safe disposal of hazardous materials, such as electronics and batteries. Residents can schedule pickups through the information provided with their new carts.

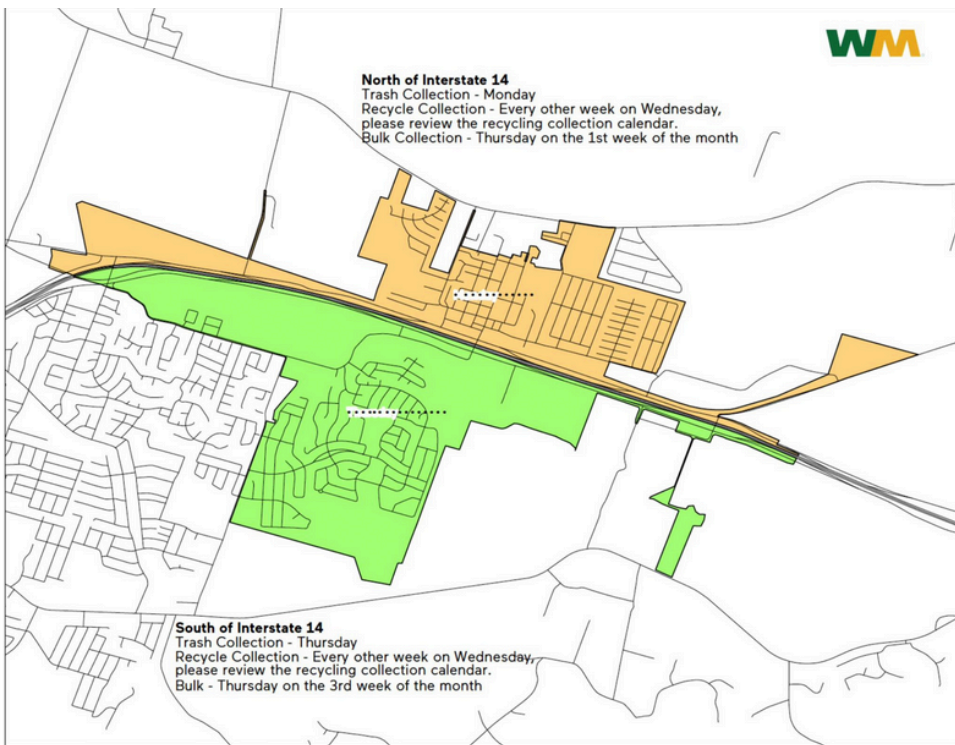

# NOLANVILLE FAITH OUTREACH CENTER OPENS FREE MEDICAL CLINIC TO SERVE THE COMMUNITY

On Saturday, September 28th, the Nolanville Faith Outreach Center officially opened its doors, welcoming community members to a new free medical clinic designed to address the healthcare needs of the medically underserved in Nolanville and Harker Heights.

The grand opening ceremony, held at noon, marked a significant milestone for the initiative, which has been in the works since 2019.

The clinic, located at 101 N Main Street, aims to provide essential health services, including treatment for colds, viruses, family care, and vaccinations.



While the facility does not keep medicine on-site, the volunteer staff, composed of approximately 10 trained medical professionals each evening, can order prescriptions for patients in need. The clinic's goal is to serve approximately 45 patients each Monday evening, with plans to expand hours of service as needed. Warden noted that during her time working in the city, she identified a critical need for healthcare services, alongside other necessities like a grocery store and a laundry facility. The opening of this clinic represents a vital step in addressing these community needs.

Patricia Warden, a pastor at Nolanville First United Methodist Church and one of the clinic's founders, emphasized the importance of accessibility in her vision for the clinic:

**"Many people do not have computer capability to connect. That's why we've decided to accept only walk-in patients. Everyone is due a good lifestyle, and we are committed to ensuring that all community members have access to quality healthcare."**

The Nolanville Faith Outreach Center, born from a vision of compassionate care, stands ready to serve the community and fulfill the pressing health needs of its residents. 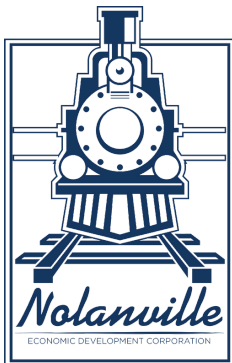

### Meet The Artists: Joe Barrington & Peter Mangan

Barrington's sculptures, including "Outliers Guide to the Universe" and "Indian Firewheel," capture the essence of local folklore and have been featured in notable locations like the Lake Ray Hubbard Transit Station in Dallas and the National Museum of Wildlife Art in Jackson Hole, Wyoming. Mangan combines his backgrounds in sculpture and glasswork, with pieces such as "She Comes in Colors" and "Twist" reflecting the vibrant energy of the Texas Hill Country, where he now resides. His work, exhibited and collected worldwide, showcases a unique fusion of form and color. Together, Barrington and Mangan exemplify Texas's rich artistic heritage.

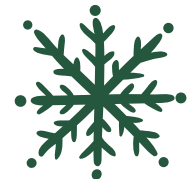
