Mayor Proclamation

NOLANVILLE TO RECOGNIZE PURPLE HEART VETERANS


During the January 5, 2023, Nolanville City Council Meeting, Mayor Andy Williams proclaimed Nolanville to be a designated Purple Heart City, honoring and remembering those who have sacrificed so much to defend our freedoms and in doing so have been awarded a Purple Heart decoration by the United States Military.

The Purple Heart award, the oldest military medal in the nation, is awarded to those who have been wounded or killed while serving in the U.S. military.

To be declared an official Purple Heart City, an official proclamation must be acknowledged and signed by a City's Mayor and then presented to the local chapter of the military order of the Purple Heart.

"By proclaiming Nolanville as a Purple Heart City, we're commanding ourselves to remember the bravery and selfless acts of service that the men and women of the armed forces have shown," said Mayor Andy Williams.



The City of Nolanville is looking for artists to help jumpstart their new public art program. This new program will take place throughout 2023 and across the City of Nolanville.

Adding public art to the City of Nolanville can add significant value to the community's cultural, visual, and economic growth.

It is proven that art enhances the quality of life for all who live near and visit it.



It helps to give a community its fosters identity, pride, community and can create a sense of belonging. Nolanville will be no exception and has much to gain in these areas through the implementation public of а art program.

The initial call for artists includes requests for four sculpture pieces to be exhibited at the Main Street underpass, dubbed The "Wonderpass." The sculptures will be placed throughout the site and will be for displayed 12 apply, months. То artists can submit up to five art pieces for consideration. and these pieces must be available for display from May 2023 to May 2024.

Joe Barrington, a well-known Texas artist, and sculptor across much of the southwest, will be working with the City and the selected artists to install the sculpture pieces.



"PUBLIC ART IS A SPECIAL INGREDIENT IN ANY COMMUNITY AND IS SOMETHING THAT EVERYONE SHOULD HAVE ACCESS TO WITHOUT MAKING SPECIAL TRIPS TO MUSEUMS AND ART GALLERIES," SAYS CITY OF NOLANVILLE MAYOR ANDY WILLIAMS. "IT SHOULD BE RIGHT THERE FOR ALL TO SEE, ENJOY AND CONSIDER."

In the coming year, the City of Nolanville will also work with artists and local organizations to create murals that will add fun elements to the public art program. The City has already begun partnering with Killeen Independent School District (KISD), the University of Mary Harden Baylor, and The Austin Arts Commission to create concepts. In addition to these partnerships, Nolanville is encouraging artists to collaborate with the local

encouraging artists to collaborate with the local schools to make the art accessible to everyone.

"Our hope is that the artists we select will bridge the gap to KISD's art programs to help bring cultural awareness of the social and economic impact of art." Says Bryan Buck, President of the Nolanville Economic Development Corporation.

THE CITY OF NOLANVILLE BRINGS HOME GRANT FOR UPGRADES TO A LOCAL PARK

The City of Nolanville has been awarded A \$150,000 small community grant from The Texas Parks & Wildlife Commission to fund improvements of Fox Park located at 603 N 10th Street.

Fox Park was added to the City in 2014 as a dedication for Oakridge apartments and is connected to the Nolanville SMART Museum, also known as the JW Sims Community Center, by way of a sidewalk on 10th street. The \$150,000 grant will go a long way towards the proposed upgrades at the already established Fox Park, including a playground with universal equipment, a pavilion, a skate park, solar lighting, a butterfly garden, and native landscaping. After polling more than 100 children and adults from the neighborhood, these new elements were decided on.

"A lot of discussion among staff, City Council, and Zoning Boards have gone into what we envision this park looking like with new updates," says Planning and Development Coordinator Jessica Navarro. "Digital surveys were sent to residents via social media, and area kids were given interactive surveys at community events that asked them what their dream park in Nolanville would look like."

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission approved more than 9.8 million dollars in local park grants to 20 communities in three categories based on community size. These grants are allocated to local government entities to help add trails, gardens, playgrounds, lighting accessibility improvements, and more to local parks. The funded sites must be adequately maintained, open to the public, and remain parkland.

The Small Community Recreation Grant category serves towns of less than 20,000 residents and was awarded to nine communities, with Nolanville receiving the highest point total in this group.

"Master Park planning is a large area of focus for Nolanville," says Nolanville City Manager Kara Escajeda. "We are excited that with this grant, we can continue to build on the quality of life of our residents regarding physical recreation and outdoor spaces."


