

FUN FACTS ABOUT THE MONARCH BUTTERFLY



- A group of monarchs is called a flutter
- 2. They can flap its wings five to 12 times per second
- 3. The Monarch is the state insect of Texas
- 4. Their average wingspan is approximately 4 inches.
- 5. They can travel up to 100 miles a day

I can't think of any one item that makes me more proud of the accomplishments on Main Street than seeing a swarm of Monarchs trading places on Greg's Blue Mist Flowers during migration. The migration of the monarch is one of the most remarkable phenomena in the natural world, and interstate 35 falls within the central flyway.

The monarch population has declined by approximately 90 percent since the 1990s. National awareness of this decline is one of the reasons that we hold a Monarch Festival in the Spring during migration and have named our largest park after this beautiful species.

Please join us in the park to dawn on your wings, participate in our color run, and plant nectar plants in the scent garden.

During the February 16, 2023, Nolanville City Council Meeting, Mayor Andy Williams presented our community partners from Grant Development Services, Katerina Dittemore & Gandolf Burrus (not pictured), with the Spirit of Nolanville award. This award is presented to those in the community who demonstrate acts of going above and beyond for the Nolanville Community.

Over the last eight years, Dittemore & Burrus have worked tirelessly alongside City Staff to bring home grants for 12 City Projects such as Monarch Park, sewer line replacements, Avenue H connectivity, and the Mary Marie Center home of the Clement Boys and Girls Club.

Most recently, they helped the City to secure a \$150,000 grant for Fox Park renovations from Texas Parks and Wildlife and a \$346,423 grant for Nolan Creek from Texas Commission on Environmental Equality.

The 12 grants have totaled an impressive 5.9 Million dollars and have undoubtedly impacted the quality of life of everyone who lives and works in the City of Nolanville.

The City of Nolanville would like to give its deepest thanks to both Katerina & Gandolf. Your commitment and compassion shown to the community of Nolanville go a long way and demonstrate your care and dedication to the community. On March 4th, 2023, 25 volunteers made up of residents from the City of Nolanville, City Hall Staff, and Members of the 504th Military Intelligence Brigade joined forces to make a meaningful change by tackling trash buildup in two areas of the community. One area is experiencing rapid construction, Warrior's path, and The other is a popular recreation destination along Nolan Creek at Levy Crossing.

This Trash-Off Event, sponsored by Keep Nolanville Beautiful as well as Roland Miranda of Allstate Insurance, was the first clean-up event of 2023 for the City of Nolanville. Volunteers collected a staggering 1500 lbs. of litter in just under two hours.

"The turnout and effort from our volunteers is a great example of residents taking pride in their community," said Keep Nolanville Beautiful Coordinator Jennifer Shidler. "We welcome and encourage people to participate in these clean-up events, and we hope to continue the trend of the great turnout throughout the year,"

Building & Location Facts:

The JW Sims Community Center, which has served as a hub for Nolanville activities since 1978, is currently undergoing a major renovation. Thanks to federal funding from the American Rescue Plan Act, the 45-year-old building is being transformed into a 21st-century SMART Museum - a learning hub of innovation and sustainable technology. The SMART Museum, designed by architects Brandstetter Carroll Inc., will offer residents hands-on experience with exciting new technologies, including virtual reality rooms and 3-D printing.



Important Facts



As a hub of digital intelligence, the SMART Museum will provide residents with a resource library, exhibit space, and podcasting rooms furnished with the latest technologies available. Visitors will be encouraged to explore curated digital and hands-on content. Ever wanted to take a design from a drawing to a 3D-printed object? How about creating your own podcast? We've got you covered! Maker studios will be available to reserve.



The Smart Museum will increase the range of career exploration and training opportunities available for students and adults using virtual reality rooms. Here, students will have access to VR for recreational play and career development. These VR experiences will provide pathways to local educational institutes and career centers such as Texas Work Force, Killeen Independent School District, Texas A&M, and Central Texas College.



Programming at the SMART Museum will focus attention on how different human interactions can impact the various environments at nearby Nolan Creek. Citizen Scientists will be given the opportunity to participate in environmental labs where sampling research of the water, soil, and air can be performed. Workshops on topics such as hydroponic gardening and sustainable living will be made available in our Naturalist Meeting Room.

SPREAD YOUR WINGS AND FLY TO THE

3RD ANNUAL MONARCH FESTIVAL

The City of Nolanville Prepares for Its 3rd Annual Monarch Festival on Saturday April 22nd from 9 AM to 12 PM.

Located at the aptly named Monarch Park, 100 Gold Star Ave, Nolanville Texas, 76559, this community event will have free kites and butterfly wings for children (while supplies last) a petting zoo, music, vendors, and face painting. Adults and children alike are invited to have fun with these activities all while helping us highlight the importance and plight of the monarch butterfly.

"Our focus is to spread awareness of the importance of the monarch butterfly. One out of three bites of food we consume is pollinated by a butterfly or a bee, yet their population numbers are down despite a slight rebound" said Jennifer Shidler Keep Nolanville Beautiful coordinator. "It is so important we get those numbers back up."

"Every spring, the monarch butterfly leaves Mexico and travels to the United States to lay eggs. In the fall, they return to Mexico for warmer weather.

"We are right in the window for their spring migration, and we make sure to plant native nectars and floras that attract them the most." said Kara Escajeda, City Manager of The City of Nolanville. "The official plant of Nolanville, Greg's Blue Mist, is the one we find they like the best."

This event brings the community together for an important cause and is also a way for local vendors and small businesses to be open to the public. Small business and food truck spots are still available through the City of Nolanville's Eventbrite page, or by contacting City Hall directly.

"This is our first big event of the year in Nolanville, and we are so excited to be together again with our neighbors and community," said Shidler. We had such great turn out to all our events last year and we are ready to carry that momentum over into 2023.

While the Monarch Festival is open to everyone, it is important to note that parking at the event will be limited. Residents living in the Woodlands (formerly known as the Plaza), the Ridges and Cedar Heights (also known as the 'dog streets') are asked to help with traffic and congestion by walking to Monarch Park. As a reminder there is a paved path near 322 Nolan Ridge that connects that neighborhood directly to the park. Those driving to the event are encouraged to utilize the spaces at the park, and then to park on Nolan Ridge, Dober, Boxer & Pointer streets and to walk over.
